# **EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA)**

Federal legislation passed to allow for the use of methods and instructional strategies to strengthen the academic program in the school, increase the amount and quality of learning, and help provide an enriched and accelerated curriculum, which may include programs, activities, and courses necessary to provide a well-rounded education.

# WHAT IS TITLE I?

- Title I is a federally funded academic assistance program for schools.
- The goal of Title I is to ensure a high quality well-rounded education for every child.

# WHAT DOES TITLE I PROVIDE AT MY CHILD'S SCHOOL?

- Extra-duty pay for teachers \$1,800
- Professional Development for teachers

- Parent Involvement learning activities for curriculum nights \$9,077

# ESSA for Schools

Ensures schools measure student progress using approved tests.

Ensures schools issue reports charting school performance.

# ESSA for Schools

Provides teacher training and professional development to improve instruction.

# ESSA for Students

Sets high expectations for academic achievement.

Requires yearly testing for Grades 3-8 and High School.

# ESSA for Students

Provides teachers who are licensed by the state of Nevada and use proven teaching methods.



# Parents' Rights

- The right to receive periodic progress reports on the child and the school.
- The right to request information about the qualifications of their child's teacher.
- The right to help decide if the school's Title I program is meeting the needs of their child.
- The right to offer suggestions for academic improvement and increased parental involvement.

# Parents' Responsibilities

- The responsibility to share information with the teacher about their child's interests and abilities.
- The responsibility to attend parent conferences and to communicate regularly with the school concerning their child's academic progress.
- The responsibility to ensure their child attends school regularly, completes all homework and classroom assignments, and adheres to the District's Educational Accord, Honor Code, and school behavior policies.
