

- Promote positive cross-cultural attitudes and behaviors




# SSAES Program Model


- Two-Way Dual Language 50/50 Model in K-2
  - Two languages are used for instruction (English/Spanish)
  - Two groups of students are involved
    - Native English speakers
    - Mative speaker of other language (Spanish)
  - Simultaneous Bi-Literacy Development
  - Language Division by time and subject
- Spanish Enrichment Program in 3rd grade
  - \$350 minutes of daily Spanish enrichment

### Title I - EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA)

Federal legislation passed to allow for the use of methods and instructional strategies to strengthen the academic program in the school, increase the amount and quality of learning, and help provide an enriched and accelerated curriculum, which may include programs, activities, and courses necessary to provide a well-rounded, high-quality education.



### WHAT IS TITLE I?

- Title I is a federally funded academic assistance program for schools.
- The goal of Title I is to ensure all children have a fair, equitable, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education.

# WHAT DOES TITLE I PROVIDE AT MY CHILD'S SCHOOL?

- Strong Start is expecting approximately \$34,523
- Funds will be used for:
  - Supplemental instructional programs \$22,146
  - Parent Involvement learning activities for curriculum nights
     \$9,077
  - Extra-duty pay for teachers \$1,800
  - Professional Development for teachers \$1,500

# ESSA for Schools

- Ensure schools issue reports charting school performance.
- Ensure schools measure student progress using approved tests.
- Provide teacher training and professional development to improve instruction.

# ESSA for Students

- Sets high expectations for academic achievement.
- Provides teachers who are licensed by the state of Nevada and use proven teaching methods.
- Requires yearly testing for Grades 3-8 and High School.

# Parents' Rights

- The <u>right</u> to receive periodic progress reports on the child and the school.
- The <u>right</u> to request information about the qualifications of their child's teacher.
- The <u>right</u> to help decide if the school's Title I program is meeting the needs of their child.
- The <u>right</u> to offer suggestions for academic improvement and increased parental involvement.

# Parents' Responsibilities

- The <u>responsibility</u> to share information with the teacher about their child's interests and abilities.
- The <u>responsibility</u> to attend parent conferences and to communicate regularly with the school concerning their child's academic progress.
- The <u>responsibility</u> to ensure their child attends school regularly, completes all homework and classroom assignments, and adheres to the school's Family Compact, Code-of-Honor, and school behavior policies.

### 2023-2024 NSPF

- This year our 3rd graders will participate in state-mandated testing, so we will receive a star-rating by the state.
- One of the areas we get rated on are absences.
- Any student with 18 absences or more are considered chronically absent from school.
- Students chronically absent count against the school.
